PUBLIC CONDUCT ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

2000.6

The Lake Country School Board hereby enacts and adopts the following regulations for the maintenance of public order on real property owned, leased, or otherwise used by the school district:

No person on school property shall:

- Injure or threaten to injure another person.
- Damage the property of another or of the school district.
- Conduct himself/herself in such manner as to impede, delay, or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct of the educational program of the school district or any other activity taking place on school property which has been authorized by the board, District Administrator, building principal, or other authorized school district employee.
- Enter upon any portion of school premises at any time for purposes other than those which are lawful and/or authorized by the board. Willfully violate other rules and regulations adopted by the board and properly publicized, designed to maintain public order on school property.

Violators shall be dealt with as follows:

• Students shall be subject to suspension and expulsion pursuant to the provisions of Section 120.13 of the Laws of Wisconsin or other penalties as may be determined. If suspension is for more than five days, students shall be entitled to a hearing under section 120.13 of the Laws of Wisconsin.

• Any other person on school property may be requested by the appropriate administrator or the building principal or his/her agent to register at the proper office stating name, address, and purpose of business on school property. Any such person having no legitimate purpose or business on school property or violating or threatening to violate the above rules relating to the maintenance of public order shall be directed to leave the premises forthwith. Should he/she fail or refuse to do so, the village police, state police, or sheriff's department shall be notified and requested to cause his/her ejection as a loiterer or trespasser.
