CHILDREN AT RISK

The Lake Country School District "Children at Risk" identification procedures are cued to the requirements of Wisconsin Statute 118.153 and Chapter PI-25 Wisconsin Administrative Code. A child is identified as "at risk" when one in each of the following sets of requirements are met:

SET I

1. Drop outs - A student who has ceased to attend school; continues to reside in the school district ; does not attend a public, private, vocational, technical or adult education district school or home-based private educational program under s.118.15 (4) Stats., on a full-time basis.
2. Attendance - Pupils who have been absent from school for 20 days or more during the school year without acceptable excuses under ss.118.15 (1) (b) to (d) or (3), and 118.16 (4) Stats.
3. Parentage - Pupils who are parents as defined under s.115.91(1) Stats. "School-age parent" means any person under the age of 21 who is not a high school graduate and is a parent, an expectant parent, or a person who has been pregnant within the immediate preceding 120 days.
4. Adjudicated Delinquents - Pupils who have been adjudicated delinquent under ss.48.02 (3m) Stats. "Delinquent" means a child who is less than 18 years of age and 12 years of age or older who has violated any state or federal criminal law except as provided in ss.48.17 or 48.18, Stats.

SET II

1. Pupils who are one or more years behind their age group by grade placement (grades 7-8).
2. Students one or more years behind their age group or grade in their basic skills (K-8) according to their standardized
