Policies of the Board of Education

Section H: Instruction

As required by WI law, the Board is adopting this written policy specifying the criteria for promoting students from the fourth grade to the fifth grade and from the eighth grade to the ninth grade.

Beginning on September 1, 2002, a fourth or eighth grader may not be promoted to the fifth or ninth grade unless he or she satisfies the criteria (see attached) for promotion as specified in this policy.

## No Social Promotion Policy <br> Fourth Grade

A student will be promoted from grade four to five upon receiving 9 promotion points including 1 point for writing proficiency according to the following criteria.

A student will be promoted from grade eight to nine upon receiving 8 promotion points including 1 point for writing proficiency according to the following criteria.

| Academic Achievement: <br> Other Academic Factors <br> For the student who scored less than basic on a section of the WKCE and/or averaged less than a C-in a core subject, other academic factors may be considered by a promotion review committee. <br> The promotion review committee would consist of three people to include an administrator and a guidance counselor.
