900.39

The Lake Country School District Administrator/designee is responsible to see that all children entering Lake Country Schools for the first time be immunized against diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio, measles, mumps and rubella and other diseases that the department specifies by rule. The administrator or school board may delegate certain tasks to other school employees (i.e. teachers, aides, health room coordinator, but this responsibility for compliance with these requirements remains with the administrator and the school board.

STUDENT IMMUNIZATIONS

900.39 Rule

No principal or administrator of any school shall admit any child who does not meet the requirements for admission as prescribed by state law.

As a part of the enrollment process for each first time admission, the school shall obtain from the parent an accurate and complete immunization history for that child indicating that the child meets the minimum immunization requirements or permission of the parent for the child to be immunized:

- 1. by a private physician specified by the parent and/or
- 2. by the local public health agency

The immunization history shall be in a format prescribed by the department.

If at that time the history indicates that the child does not meet the minimum immunization requirement under state law an the parent chooses not to grant permission for the child to be immunized, the school shall obtain from the parent a written statement to the school objecting to the immunization for reasons of health, religion or personal conviction.

By October 15 or within 45 days after admission for any particular student the school shall submit a repot to the local public health agency indicating the name, immunization status, and the compliance alternative selected for each student who does not meet the minimum immunization requirements under section 140.05 (16) Wis. Stats. The initial report by October 15 shall be in a format prescribed by the department and shall also include statistical information concerning the compliance alternative selected for all first time admissions.

The school shall maintain on file the immunization histories and/or waivers of children entering school for the first time. These shall be maintained for any particular child as long as that child attends the school in accordance with state law

- A. The school shall update these immunization histories with information supplied by the local public health agency, parents, or private physicians.
- B. The immunization history or record of any student who transfers from one school to another shall be forwarded to the new school in accordance with state law.
