As we continue to look toward the future, we have some challenges at Lake Country School District that we will overcome. Our two biggest challenges are the age of our building and our operational (financial) needs.

We have a building that is 30 years old and is in need of large-scale repair and renovation. A Capital Improvement Referendum will be needed to meet the financial costs of repair and renovation. Four years ago the Board of Education and administration, began exploring a referendum with SiteLogiQ. The process was halted due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, the previous administrator's leave and the time spent finding a full-time administrator.

The Board of Education has re-engaged with SiteLogiQ to be our partner in the referendum process. SiteLogiQ will be able to provide community engagement, communications, design and building support, and logistics to our needed project. Our first goal of the referendum is to replace the 30-year-old roof. In addition, we will have the opportunity to upgrade to a more efficient HVAC system and replace windows which will reduce energy costs. We will evaluate and continue to improve our building security. Walking through the building you may have noticed hallways and classrooms need new flooring, classrooms need new furniture, and everything could use a fresh coat of paint.

Schools in the State of Wisconsin face many financial challenges when it comes to operating expenses, and unfortunately, Lake Country School District is no different. During the 2021-2023 Biennial Budget cycle, the State of Wisconsin froze K-12 public education funding. This has had a negative impact on all schools. The 2023-2025 Biennial Budget is currently being worked on at the State level. It will be some time before the State shares the details of this funding for schools. As operating expenses remain and continue to rise, we, unfortunately, must look for ways to reduce our spending trying not to compromise the strong programming offered at Lake Country School.

The Board of Education is committed to exploring all avenues to find the best possible solutions to our challenges. These are not easy discussions to have, but we are working hard to find the best possible outcomes. The goal is to continue to make sure that the Lake Country School District is viable in the future.

My door is always open for conversation around any and all topics related to Lake Country School District.
