

The Global Experience at AHS

The Global Experience at Arrowhead High School supports students who are interested in preparing themselves for their roles as global citizens in an ever-changing global society. This experience aims to help students become globally competent by practicing these skills across a variety of subject areas:

1. investigate themes of global significance
2. recognize one's own perspective and gain perspectives from others
3. communicate with a number of different audiences far and near
4. take action on issues of global significance in an effort to improve our world

This experience is enhanced by the State of Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction in that students can also, in addition to participating in the AHS Global Experience, earn the Global Education Achievement Certificate (GEAC) awarded to graduating seniors who have fulfilled all DPI requirements. Successful participation in the Arrowhead Global Experience will fulfill the DPI requirements. Graduating seniors will receive a certificate from the DPI and a stamp on their diploma acknowledging them as "Global Scholars".
